Laurentiuslay | Alte Reben

The name *Leiwener Laurentiuslay* is truly music to my ears. This vineyard ranks among the finest the Mosel has to offer. Interestingly, it only became part of our estate in 1982, when the administration of Weingut Reichsgraf von Kesselstatt decided to part with 6,000 vines from one of its very best sites. Since then, some of our most exceptional wines have grown here. Through further acquisitions, we have expanded our holdings in the Laurentiuslay to a full one hectare.

One of the greatest honors is the classification of Laurentiuslay as a “First Class” (in German = 1. Lage) site by both Hugh Johnson and Stuart Pigott – a distinction that makes us particularly proud.

It was a stroke of luck that the vineyard's steep terraces and dry stone walls were preserved: the terrain was simply too costly for land consolidation. Today, the Laurentiuslay still displays its original, historical structure, with countless small terraces winding through the slope. The microclimate here is almost Mediterranean, attracting not only thriving vines, but also warmth-loving plants and animals.

On sunny days, lizards bask on the warm slate stone.
