## Ritsch Großes Gewächs



Grand Cru

The classification of the finest vineyards is progressing. Only classified terroir may carry the designation “Großes Gewächs”. We take pride in cultivating sites that meet the demanding standards for these wines: Laurentiuslay, Ritsch, and Maximin Herrenberg. The vineyards must be classified according to the Großes Gewächs rules of the Bernkasteler Ring. Allowed yields are limited to just 50 hl/ha with the highest grape ripeness.

The gray slate of the Ritsch vineyard is interspersed with silicate inclusions. This terroir produces the typical ripe citrus aromas of the Ritsch, which bring vibrant tension to the wine at high ripeness levels. The Ritsch grapes are harvested very late, with yields around 35 hl/ha. The concentration of ripeness, mineral aromas, and graceful elegance is captivating. It is important to me that despite the intense concentration of aromas, the wine retains the light character typical of Mosel Riesling.
